Why does Dr. Grady's diagnosis devastate Amber? How does her reaction reflect common fears with chronic illness?

6.

What does Willow's jealousy reveal about her drive for worth?

7.

How does each woman reach for independence? Which ways are healthy and which ways are not?

8.

What mother and father wounds does each character carry?

9.

Why does burning Butch's home haunt Willow? How does "duty" clash with compassion in war (or ministry)?

Amber learns to go to God for her identity. What words has He spoken over you?

From Willow's spoon to cardinals, what signs are present in this book to show God's nearness? Has God ever given you such a sign? What was it?

What themes unite both timelines in the novel? What timeless truths does the book reveal?

How do the characters' trials expose their true identity? How have you seen this in your own life?

14.

What motivates Amber to serve? What about Lily? Can you identify with their motivations?

15.

Which character arc was your favorite? Why?

What does the title mean to you?
